# PSALM OF THE DAY

<u>Psalm 78 (page 95)</u>

This psalm is a summary record of God's gracious deeds for the rescue of his people, and their often rebellion response to the Word. This psalm calls us to remember: God always keeps his Word, both the threats and the promise; he remains faithful, even if all people are found untrue.

#### FIRST LESSON

Amos 7:10-15

Amos, like many in scripture, had an immediate call from God. Today our called ministers receive calls from God through the congregation. Those who serve do well to remember and cherish the saving function given them by the Lord. Hearers do well to listen to the Word of the Lord and give thanks that he cares enough for them to send his servants into their midst with that Word.

Then Amaziah the priest of Bethel sent a message to Jeroboam king of Israel: "Amos is raising a conspiracy against you in the very heart of Israel. The land cannot bear all his words. For this is what Amos is saying:

"Jeroboam will die by the sword, and Israel will surely go into exile, away from their native land."

Then Amaziah said to Amos, "Get out, you seer! Go back to the land of Judah. Earn your bread there and do your prophesying there. Don't prophesy anymore at Bethel, because this is the king's sanctuary and the temple of the kingdom."

Amos answered Amaziah, "I was neither a prophet nor a prophet's son, but I was a shepherd, and I also took care of sycamore-fig trees. But the LORD took me from tending the flock and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'

### SECOND LESSON

Ephesians 1:3-14

All of God's grace is but a mystery until God reveals it and gives the message for proclamation.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will-- to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, to be put into effect when the times will have reached their

fulfillment--to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.

In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession--to the praise of his glory.

#### SERMON

The essence of the message is trust. Trust in the Lord, who calls to repentance, that he will forgive and still be gracious. The messengers called by him to preach that Word need to learn before all others to trust. And so Jesus sends them out with nothing but his promise to rely on.

Calling the Twelve to him, he sent them out two by two and gave them authority over evil spirits.

These were his instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff--no bread, no bag, no money in your belts. Wear sandals but not an extra tunic. Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town. And if any place will not welcome you or listen to you, shake the dust off your feet when you leave, as a testimony against them."

They went out and preached that people should repent. They drove out many demons and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.






#### **PRAYER OF THE DAY**
