# 12<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost: Series B

The bread that God gives enables us to do the impossible.

# First Lesson: 1 Kings 19:3-8

Elijah had plenty of reasons to complain. But God ignores every one of his complaints and strengthens him so that Elijah can do what he considers impossible.

Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went a day's journey into the desert. He came to a broom tree, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, LORD," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." Then he lay down under the tree and fell asleep.

All at once an angel touched him and said, "Get up and eat." He looked around, and there by his head was a cake of bread baked over hot coals, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again.

The angel of the LORD came back a second time and touched him and said, "Get up and eat, for the journey is too much for you." So he got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God.

### **Psalm of the Day:** <u>Psalm 34</u> (p. 80)

"Taste and see!" Has not this always been God's way with us? The lions seem so strong but only suffer want and finally perish. The children of God seem so weak and perishing but live to praise the God who saves them so that they may continue to worship him in accord with his Word.

### Second Lesson: Ephesians 4:30-5:2

The works God calls on us to do are impossible for natural man. But the gospel motivates and encourages us to want to do these impossible things.


And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

## Gospel: John 6:41-51

Here Jesus calls for the most impossible thing of all: faith, the quiet trust that he is truly God's Son and our Savior who keeps all of his Word, even the promise to raise us up from the dead.

At this the Jews began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"

"Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him, and I will raise him up at the last day. It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who listens to the Father and learns from him comes to me. No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father. I tell you the truth, he who believes has everlasting life. I am the bread of life. Your forefathers ate the manna in the desert, yet they died. But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which a man may eat and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."
