Saints Triumphant. We will live together forever with God in heaven. This is God's commitment to us. He lived and died in our place so that we have the victory. He lived and died in the place of the members of Zion who have died in the past year. This is his commitment to them. They died knowing heaven was theirs. They heard the gospel because those before us made the commitment to build this house of worship and this ministry in Morrison. What is our response? First Lesson

Daniel 12:1-3

Second Lesson

Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God. Since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool, because by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.

The Holy Spirit also testifies to us about this. First he says: "This is the covenant I will make with them after that time, says the Lord. I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds." Then he adds: "Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more." And where these have been forgiven, there is no longer any sacrifice for sin.
