Love is the fulfillment of the law. God's Son fulfilled the law because we could not.

First Lesson: Leviticus 19:1,2,15-18

The holiness that our holy God rightfully expects of his people is total. How difficult it is to keep our obligation to our neighbor: "Love your neighbor as yourself!" A brief look at God's specific commands regarding partiality, slander, and hatred strike our hearts with guilt and fear. No one can save us except our Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave his life to save his neighbors.

The LORD said to Moses, "Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: 'Be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy.

"Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly.

"Do not go about spreading slander among your people.

"'Do not do anything that endangers your neighbor's life. I am the LORD.

"Do not hate your brother in your heart. Rebuke your neighbor frankly so you will not share in his guilt."

"'Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against one of your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the LORD."

Psalm of the Day: Psalm 33 (page 79)

God's people rejoice in the faithfulness he has shown from the creation through all generations.

Second Lesson: 1 Thessalonians 1:5b-10

From The message of salvation through Jesus became far-flung through the lives of the Thessalonian Christians. Their conviction led them to imitate the apostles, to welcome the message with holy joy, and to even endure suffering for it. How powerfully the gospel is proclaimed in the lives of God's believers!

You know how we lived among you for your sake. You became imitators of us and of the Lord; in spite of severe suffering, you welcomed the message with the joy given by the Holy Spirit. And so you became a model to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and

Achaia--your faith in God has become known everywhere. Therefore we do not need to say anything about it, for they themselves report what kind of reception you gave us. They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead--Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-46

All the commandments can be summed up in a single command: "Love." It is impossible for us sinful mortals to love our neighbor as ourselves. How much less can we love God with all our being! But thanks be to God! He sent Jesus, our Savior, to take our place under his justice. In Christ these two commandments have their perfect fulfillment, and we are declared holy and just.

Hearing that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, the Pharisees got together. One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, "What do you think about the Christ? Whose son is he?"

"The son of David," they replied.

He said to them, "How is it then that David, speaking by the Spirit, calls him 'Lord'? For he says,

"The Lord said to my Lord:

"Sit at my right hand

until I put your enemies

under your feet.""

If then David calls him 'Lord,' how can he be his son?" No one could say a word in reply, and from that day on no one dared to ask him any more questions.
