Sermon: Acts 13:1-5 **Set Apart For Service**

An unlikely group A Spirit directed task

3rd Sunday after Epiphany—Series B

Jesus shows his glory in the kind of people that he calls to serve him and in using the gospel to make them willing to follow him.

First Lesson: 1 Kings 19:19-21

When Elisha is called to follow Elijah, God does not force him against his will. He molds his will and shapes it, so that Elisha is willing to leave good gifts that God gave him earlier and take up a life of service. The call to discipleship may ask us to give up good things that God had given us earlier.

So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him. Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother good-by," he said, "and then I will come with you."

"Go back," Elijah replied. "What have I done to you?"

So Elisha left him and went back. He took his yoke of oxen and slaughtered them. He burned the plowing equipment to cook the meat and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out to follow Elijah and became his attendant.

Psalm of the Day: <u>Psalm 62</u> (p. 88)

Second Lesson: Acts 13:1-5

What could this grouping Antioch possibly have in common? They loved their Savior and were filled by the Sprit with a desire to serve him.

In the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." So after they had fasted and

prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

The two of them, sent on their way by the Holy Spirit, went down to Seleucia and sailed from there to Cyprus. When they arrived at Salamis, they proclaimed the word of God in the Jewish synagogues. John was with them as their helper.

Gospel: Mark 1:14-20

Notice the sharp contrast: the first verse makes the all the rest of the verses seem foolish. If God could not keep John out of prison, why would anyone want to follow the one whom John proclaimed as Messiah?

After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!" As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.
