Confession/Absolution

M: We have come into the presence of our God, who created us to be like him without sin and blemish. We have not loved him with our whole heart, soul, and mind as he commanded. In

so many ways we have preferred to follow the thinking of the world and the cravings of our hearts rather than to trust and obey him. He commands us to get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice, and to be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave us. Yet so many times we have failed. Let us bring this to the Lord, asking for his mercy.

C: (sung) Before you, God, the Judge of all, With grief and shame I humbly fall. I see my sins against you, Lord, My sins of thought and deed and word. They press me sore; to you I flee: O God, be merciful to me!

> O Lord, my God, to you I pray: Oh, cast me not in wrath away! Let your good Spirit ne'er depart, But let him draw to you my heart That truly penitent I be: O God, be merciful to me!

Time for personal reflection and prayer

- M; Together, let us confess our sins and seek God's forgiveness:
- C: Father, I have sinned against you and am no longer worthy to be called your child. Have mercy on me according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.
- M: God has not abandoned us as his children but sent his Son to earth to be our brother to live the perfect life we could not live. Because of Christ's love he died once for all to become the atoning sacrifice for all sin. In Christ we can draw near to God in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience. Therefore, as a called servant of

Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C:(sung) Oh, the height of Jesus' love, Higher than the heav'ns above, Deeper than the depths of sea, Lasting as eternity, Love that found me -- wondrous thought! Found me when I sought him not.

First Lesson

Acts 2:37-47

When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."

With many other words he warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Second Lesson

Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called "uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcision" (that done in the body by the hands of men) remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.
