For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.
- M: God has not abandoned us as his children but sent his Son to earth to be our brother to live the perfect life we could not live. Because of Christ's love he died once for all to become the atoning sacrifice for all sin. In Christ we can draw near to God in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.


WELS Regional Choral Festival will be at MLHS November 12-14. 250 Lutheran high school choir members will join together to present two concerts during the weekend.
