THE WORD

First Lesson:

1 Samuel 12:20-24

At Saul's coronation, Samuel gives his farewell speech to Israel. Helping Israel to recognize its sin of idolatry, Samuel encourages faithfulness to the Lord in remembrance of the Lord's promised deliverance both past and future. As recipients of the Lord's gracious salvation, we do not forget what God has done. Rather, heartfelt thanksgiving and fearless devotion to him and his people mark our lives of faith.

²⁰ "Do not be afraid," Samuel replied. "You have done all this evil; yet do not turn away from the LORD, but serve the LORD with all your heart. ²¹ Do not turn away after useless idols. They can do you no good, nor can they rescue you, because they are useless. ²² For the sake of his great name the LORD will not reject his people, because the LORD was pleased to make you his own. ²³ As for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by failing to pray for you. And I will teach you the way that is good and right. ²⁴ But be sure to fear the LORD and serve him faithfully with all your heart; consider what great things he has done for you. (NIV)

Second Lesson

2 Corinthians 1:8-11

The prayers of the saints rise up to heaven as Paul found himself in deadly peril. How many days have come and gone that have found us uncertain of the future? We find ourselves in circumstances that leave us excessively burdened, questioning how we will survive. And then the Lord's deliverance comes. He who raised the Lord Jesus from the dead will raise us up from deadly peril and hardship, causing thanksgiving in our hearts and in the hearts of many others. Because our hope is founded on his promise, our thanks pour forth both now and into eternity.

⁸ We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. ⁹ Indeed, we felt we had received the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. ¹⁰ He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us again. On him we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us, ¹¹ as you help us by your prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favor granted us in answer to the prayers of many. (NIV)

Whether it's leprosy of the body or leprosy of the soul, Jesus has cleansed the afflicted. In his compassion for those diseased by sin, he has given his life to restore our membership in the family of our Father. By faith, our hearts are now moved to thankfulness for the healing hand of our gracious Lord. Our whole lives will be filled with thanksgiving.

¹¹ Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance ¹³ and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

¹⁵ One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

¹⁷ Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

News From the WELS

In its September meeting, WELS Church Extension Fund (WELS CEF) gave WELS Home Missions a \$1.3 million grant, which will help six congregations purchase land or build facilities more quickly than is normally the case.

"When we're blessed with strong financial results like last year, we feel we're able to use the extra income to jump-start certain congregations recommended to us by Home Missions," says Mr. Paul Beitlich, chairman of WELS CEF. "We want to see them take advantage of the opportunities that are there today."

All the congregations receiving special grant money this year already were pursuing land purchase and/or facility construction or acquisition. These funds will help them build more quickly and have less debt. The congregations will contin-

ue to work with WELS CEF for financing through loans and/or additional grants.

The six congregations receiving special grant money are Shepherd of the Hills, Las Vegas, Nev.; Grace Hmong, Kansas City, Kan.; The Springs, Sparks, Nev.; Living Promise, Morristown, Tenn.; Trinity, St. Lucia, West Indies; and Holy Word, Pflugerville, Tex.

The mission of WELS CEF is to provide financing through loans and grants to mission congregations so they can acquire land and ministry facilities to be used for gospel outreach. In the past 20 years, WELS CEF has given more than \$25 million to missions or missionminded congregations in matching grant money—which doesn't include the special grants to Home Missions. More than \$16 million of new loans and \$1.7 million



new re-

quests were approved in fiscal year 2012 –13.

Free is thankful for Home Mission's partnership with WELS CEF. "Through the years, WELS CEF has been a valued partner of Home Missions," says Free. "We pray this special grant as well as the continued support of WELS CEF blesses Home Missions to reach many more souls with the saving gospel of Jesus Christ."
