What A Friend

THE WORD

First Lesson: Genesis 32:22-30

His old name meant "heel-grabber," but he was about to get a new name, "Israel, the one who wrestles with God." Jacob found himself faced by a large force of men with his brother Esau. Uncertain of what the future held, Jacob turned to the Lord in prayer. Thankful for the blessings showered on him by the God of the Covenant, he calls on the name of the Lord for protection. As Jacob wrestled with God on the banks of the Jabbok, so Christ invites us to wrestle with God in prayer. Let us be determined to hold our heavenly Father to his promises. This is our privilege and duty won by him who struggled and has overcome the gates of hell itself.

During the night Jacob got up and took his two wives, his two female slaves, and his 11 sons, and crossed the ford of Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, along with all his possessions.

²⁴ Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him until daybreak.²⁵ When the man saw that He could not defeat him, He struck Jacob's hip socket as they wrestled and dislocated his hip. ²⁶ Then He said to Jacob, "Let Me go, for it is daybreak."

But Jacob said, "I will not let You go unless You bless me."

Gospel: <u>Luke 18:1-8a</u>

The persistent widow was determined: she would receive justice, even from a corrupt judge. Her determination kept her begging for justice day after day. In the end she received her due even from a judge with no fear of God and no respect for his fellow man. Learn a lesson in prayerful persistence: How much more will our heavenly Father work justice and bring deliverance to those determined in prayer!

He then told them a parable on the need for them to pray always and not become discouraged: ² "There was a judge in a certain town who didn't fear God or respect man. ³ And a widow in that town kept coming to him, saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.'

⁴ "For a while he was unwilling, but later he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or respect man, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps pestering me, I will give her justice, so she doesn't wear me out by her persistent coming.'"

⁶ Then the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ Will not God grant justice to His elect who cry out to Him day and night? Will He delay to help them? ⁸ I tell you that He will swiftly grant them justice. (HCSB)

News From the WELS

The Conference of Presidents (COP) met for its fall meeting last week. As always, the COP received reports from various individuals and groups, discussed a wide range of topics dealing with doctrine and practice, and made decisions on a number of issues.

Rev. Kurt Lueneburg, director of the Ministry of Christian Giving, reported that \$3.4 million in gifts have been received for the construction of the Early Childhood Learning Center at Martin Luther College, New Ulm, Minn., with only \$199,000 remaining to reach the goal. The new center will be dedicated Oct. 27. the synod's structure and programs.

Other reports included:

A progress report on the hymnal project by Rev. Michael Schultz, the project's director

A report on the initial work done by the special committee looking at fellowship practices in our schools by committee

chairman Rev. Earle Treptow A report on the work being done by Conquerors through Christ, a program of the Commission on Special Ministries to help congregations address the problems caused by internet pornography. Icards are in church basement)

The COP discussed areas of the synod's work and structure that could be considered by the newly appointed Ad Hoc Commission II. This commission was established by the convention to continue the work of the previous commission by suggesting ways to improve

Also adopted was a procedure to be followed by congregations considering the elimination of called positions due to changes in ministry needs or financial circumstances. This procedure, intended to uphold both the biblical principles involving the divine call as well as to show

appropriate Christian love and concern for called workers, will be shared by the districts presidents when congregations are facing such decisions.

The COP also adopted preliminary plans for the gathering of the special offering in 2015 to retire the synod's capital

The following individuals were appointed by the synod presidium to the Ad Hoc Commission II: Rev. Joel Voss (Chairman), Rev. Thomas Unke, Rev. Duane Rodewald, Rev. Jon Buchholz, Teacher Michael Hein, Teacher Daniel Brands, Mr. Warren Ehlke, and Mr. Harvey Dunn. This commission is to carry out its work and bring a final report to the 2015 convention.

The next meeting of the COP will take place in January. Please continue to keep these men in your prayers as they carry out their important work.
