Love Grows Here

First Lesson:

1 Samuel 26:7-25

Would anyone have faulted David for killing Saul? Saul had unfairly abused him; Saul had unfairly exiled him; Saul had unfairly tried to kill him. David could have claimed his actions were in self-defense or in fighting a just war or in taking the office to which he had been anointed. Who would have found fault with him? Certainly not the sons of Zeruiah! Though unfailingly brave, they could never understand David's lack of pragmatic action (see Abner, Absalom, Shimei, etc.). Yet David showed again that he was a man after God's own heart. David trusted that his reward was with his God, and so he had no need for vengeance. That freed him to be able to love even his enemy Saul.

⁷ So David and Abishai went to the army by night, and there was Saul, lying asleep inside the camp with his spear stuck in the ground near his head. Abner and the soldiers were lying around him.

⁸ Abishai said to David, "Today God has delivered your enemy into your hands. Now let me pin him to the ground with one thrust of the spear; I won't strike him twice."

⁹ But David said to Abishai, "Don't destroy him! Who can lay a hand on the LORD's anointed and be guiltless?" ¹⁰ As surely as the LORD lives," he said, "the LORD himself will strike him, or his time will come and he will die, or he will go into battle and perish. ¹¹ But the LORD forbid that I should lay a hand on the LORD's anointed. Now get the spear and water jug that are near his head, and let's go."

¹² So David took the spear and water jug near Saul's head, and they left. No one saw or knew about it, nor did anyone wake up. They were all sleeping, because the LORD had put them into a deep sleep.

¹³ Then David crossed over to the other side and stood on top of the hill some distance away; there was a wide space between them. ¹⁴ He called out to the army and to Abner son of Ner, "Aren't you going to answer me, Abner?"

Abner replied, "Who are you who calls to the king?"

¹⁵ David said, "You're a man, aren't you? And who is like you in Israel? Why didn't you guard your lord the king? Someone came to destroy your lord the king. ¹⁶ What you have done is not good. As surely as the LORD lives, you and your men must die, because you did not guard your master, the LORD's anointed. Look around you. Where are the king's spear and water jug that were near his head?"

¹⁷ Saul recognized David's voice and said, "Is that your voice, David my son?"

David replied, "Yes it is, my lord the king." ¹⁸ And he added, "Why is my lord pursuing his servant? What have I done, and what wrong am I guilty of? ¹⁹ Now let my lord the king listen to his servant's words. If the LORD has incited you against me, then may he accept an offering. If, however, people have done it, may they be cursed before the LORD! They have driven me today from my share in the LORD's

inheritance and have said, ‘Go, serve other gods.’ ²⁰ Now do not let my blood fall to the ground far from the presence of the LORD. The king of Israel has come out to look for a flea—as one hunts a partridge in the mountains.”

²¹ Then Saul said, “I have sinned. Come back, David my son. Because you considered my life precious today, I will not try to harm you again. Surely I have acted like a fool and have been terribly wrong.”

²² “Here is the king’s spear,” David answered. “Let one of your young men come over and get it.

²³ The LORD rewards everyone for their righteousness and faithfulness. The LORD delivered you into my hands today, but I would not lay a hand on the LORD’s anointed. ²⁴ As surely as I valued your life today, so may the LORD value my life and deliver me from all trouble.”

²⁵ Then Saul said to David, “May you be blessed, David my son; you will do great things and surely triumph.”

So David went on his way, and Saul returned home. (New International Version)

Psalm of the Day:

Psalm 103 (p. 105 of CW)

Second Lesson

Romans 12:9-21

In the twelfth chapter of Romans Paul urges us to offer our bodies as living sacrifices to God. In this lesson we find practical examples of how spiritual acts of worship are offered to God through our love for our neighbor. Loving our brothers and sharing with those in need certainly makes sense. But like Jesus, Paul goes further: bless your persecutors and don’t take revenge because that is God’s domain. Our domain is the opposite of vengeance; our domain is the imitation of Christ. Sons of the Father love their enemies and pray for their persecutors.

⁹ Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰ Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. ¹¹ Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. ¹² Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. ¹³ Share with the Lord’s people who are in need. Practice hospitality.

¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. ¹⁷ Do not be conceited.

¹⁷ Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. ¹⁸ If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. ¹⁹ Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God’s wrath, for it is written: “It is mine to avenge; I will repay,” says the Lord. ²⁰ On the contrary:

“If your enemy is hungry, feed him;
if he is thirsty, give him something to drink.

In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head.”

²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (NIV)

Alleluia! Alleluia! Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word of Christ. Alleluia! Alleluia!

M: The Gospel according to Matthew chapter 5

Gospel:

Matthew 5:38-48

Our flesh finds Jesus' commands revolting. The human animal snarls when attacked and bites back when bitten. Jesus, however, tells us not to resist evil, to turn the other cheek, to love our enemies. Who would live like this? Only the Son of our heavenly Father. God demonstrated his love for us in this: when we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Jesus himself prayed for his enemies who crucified him. He most certainly was his Father's Son. Now God calls us, his sons, to live like Jesus and love people as perfectly as the Father does. As God makes the sun rise on the evil and the good, so he commands us to shine the light of our love on everyone around us.

³⁸“You have heard that it was said, ‘Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.’ ³⁹ But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. ⁴⁰ And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. ⁴¹ If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. ⁴² Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.

⁴³“You have heard that it was said, ‘Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’ ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect. (NIV)

WELS Daily Devotions Even Easier To Access

WELS Commission on Evangelism is making it even easier to access a devotion each day. The commission's Daily Devotions are available in an ever-growing number of ways, one of which should fit into almost anyone's lifestyle. More than 9,000 people subscribe to receive these devotions via e-mail. Or for on-the-go convenience, you can listen to these devotions via podcast as you drive to work, exercise, or cook dinner. You can also read the devotions on www.wels.net, [Facebook](#), [Twitter](#), www.WhatAboutJesus.com, or—new in 2014—[Google+](#). Audio and text formats are also available through the [WELS mobile app](#).

The Commission on Evangelism began coordinating these devotions, written by WELS pastors, in 2001. Over the years the reach of these devotions has continued to grow and grow. In addition to the thousands of e-mail subscribers, hundreds—perhaps thousands—more read and listen to the

devotions online each weekday. For example, with more than 14,500 followers of the WELS Facebook page, the number of people who read the devotions each day on Facebook is considerable. As Rev. Mike Hintz, director of the Commission on Evangelism, explains, the devotions are also easily shared, so the true reach of these devotions is impossible to determine.

Facebook users recently commented on how they use WELS' Daily Devotions. Here are some of their comments:

- "I listen to them every morning while getting ready for work. Really puts my mind in the right place, and I'm focused and ready to take on anything the day might bring."
- "I get them via e-mail and normally they are the first e-mail I read each day. A blessed way to start each day. Often I share the prayers via Facebook Timeline."

- "Great outreach for my friends because I get to share!"
- "My husband and I usually listen to them together in the evening, just before bed."
- "It is a part of my daily Bible reading and prayer time."
- "I read them on Facebook and share with my friends! Great way to start the day."
Rev. Thomas Kock, one of the writers of the Daily Devotions, says, "When I'm writing them, I'm looking at them as being a good-news pick-me-up. I'd like the reader to say, 'Wow, what a wonderful God I have, who has saved me!' If people are convinced of that, they will be able to handle whatever the day throws at them."
