Work While It Is Day

First Lesson: Genesis 12:1-8

God's plan of salvation called for one special nation which would carry the Promise of the Seed meant for all people. From the beginning, this nation would be built on faith in the promises of God. God told Abram to leave all he knew and go to a place yet unknown and wait for blessings as yet undefined. God revealed that the Seed of woman promised in the garden would now descend from the family of an old man and his barren wife living as strangers in a land not yet their own. No logic or emotion could have led Abram to leave his home—only trust in his Savior God. Abram believed and set God's plan in motion to build a nation on the promises of God to fulfill the promises of God. All people would be blessed by the nation descended from Abram, because this man of faith would bear the bloodline of the Promised Seed, the Messiah who would come as Savior of all nations.

12 The LORD had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you.

² "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you;

I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.

³I will bless those who bless you,

and whoever curses you I will curse;

and all peoples on earth

will be blessed through you."

⁴So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran. ⁵He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all the

possessions they had accumulated and the people they had acquired in Harran, and they set out for the land of Canaan, and they arrived there.

⁶ Abram traveled through the land as far as the site of the great tree of Moreh at Shechem. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. ⁷ The LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built an altar there to the LORD, who had appeared to him.

⁸ From there he went on toward the hills east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east. There he built an altar to the LORD and called on the name of the LORD. (New International Version)

Psalm of the Day:

Psalm 121 (p. 112 of CW)

Second Lesson

Romans 4:1-5,13-17

Paul taught the Romans about faith by using Abraham as an example. Faith is simply receiving the grace of God by trusting in his promises. This God credits to us as righteousness. Abraham's righteousness did not come by doing but by believing. What did Abraham do? Nothing! God did it all: He made the promises; he gave the inheritance; he gave the child, the blessing for all nations. Abraham merely received the promises of God by believing that the One who made the promises was faithful. And then what happened? God acted again and credited this faith to Abraham as righteousness. This is the righteousness that every person needs to stand in God's presence. This is the righteousness that the sinful woman at the well, and even faithful Abraham lacked. This is the righteousness God gives. We are people like Abraham, who believe that God justifies the wicked. And so God forgives our wickedness and calls us righteous—no, even more—he gives us righteousness in the place of our wickedness. This is the living water that slakes the thirst of every believing soul.

4 What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, discovered in this matter? ² If, in fact, Abraham was justified by works, he had something to boast about—but not before God. ³ What does Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness."

⁴Now to the one who works, wages are not credited as a gift but as an obligation. ⁵However, to the one who does not work but trusts God who justifies the ungodly, their faith is credited as righteousness.

¹³ It was not through the law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise that he would be heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith. ¹⁴ For if those who depend on the law are heirs, faith means nothing and the promise is worthless, ¹⁵ because the law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression.

¹⁶ Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring—not only to those who are of the law but also to those who have the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. ¹⁷ As it is written: "I have made you a father of many nations." He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed—the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not. (NIV)

Gospel: John 4:5-26

He defied popular convention by traveling through Samaria. He defied religious convention by asking a Samaritan woman for a drink. Why would Jesus even bother with this woman? She was a Samaritan and a habitual adulterer. Yet he had to be here (Jn 4:4), not because of convention or expectations but because of his mission to save all people. He had come to save the world, and that meant he had come for this woman, too. Not because she had lived a holy life—far from it! Only because of his grace. He used the mirror of the Law to incite within her a thirst for mercy that could only be sated by the living water of grace. A Samaritan...a sinner...and yet Jesus opens the flood gates of the water of life and reveals his true identity as the Promised Seed, the Anointed One, her Savior. He calls her to faith, and she believes and finds living water for her thirsty soul.

⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon.

⁷When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸(His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)

¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

¹¹ "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

¹⁶ He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back."

¹⁷ "I have no husband," she replied.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. ¹⁸ The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."

¹⁹ "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

²¹ "Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not

know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

²⁵ The woman said, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am he." (NIV)

Letter From the Chairman of the MLHS Board of Control

By now you have probably been informed by your delegates of the pressing financial needs your high school is encountering as we plan the budget for the next school year. I can assure you that there is no fat left to trim. The Board of Control and the faculty and administration have continuously worked to be the most efficient we possibly can with the support dollars entrusted to us. The 2014-2015 proposed budget freezes salaries at current levels and does not even include the automatic step increase normally given to called workers based on accumulation of another year of experience. All faculty members are carrying full loads, most even beyond full, and still providing an outstanding educational experience for our children along with the daily nurturing in God's Word. Most extracurricular tasks, such as coaching, are not compensated with additional pay but are still willingly provided by the staff. For them and their willingness to serve the Kingdom, we give grateful thanks to the Lord.

Running a high school is an expensive proposition, of that there is no doubt. Each of you wrestling with a congregational budget knows the impact of health insurance and utility costs as they relentlessly march upward. Our current cost per student is about \$9,600 and the child's family provides \$5,100 of that amount. About 34% of our families are aided by tuition assistance from various high school funds and some are also assisted by their home congregation. Again we are grateful for that help. But the

we need to understand that excessive increases in the required family contribution will ultimately discourage enrollment and spiral the costs upward again. For several years, we were able to keep the tuition cost level but it did increase \$100 last year and the budget, as currently proposed, includes a \$200 tuition increase.

There are three support streams that cover the cost of running the school: tuition, congregational support and third source funding. Of these, only tuition is controlled by the Federation delegates. Third source general fund contributions from such streams as Scrip and Repeat Performance have steadily increased in recent years. Again, for that we are grateful and thank the Lord for these blessings. But congregational support has eroded in past years. In the last 5 years, it has declined about \$100,000. Some of that shortfall in recent years has been absorbed by undesignated bequests. This year those beguests have not materialized as in the past. That forces the Federation delegates to have to adjust the only number in their control, namely. tuition

The proposed budget, with no salary increase and a significant \$200 increase in tuition, still comes up about \$120,000 short on income. The Federation delegates, in the February meeting, delayed adoption of the budget until the May meeting to allow us to revisit the income sources and hopefully find a

great majority of our families pay the full amount and way to balance the budget without burdening the current students with an overwhelming tuition increase. Each \$20,000 of shortfall requires an additional \$100 in tuition. So, with no more assistance from congregations, a tuition increase of \$600 beyond the proposed \$200 might be necessary. That's almost 16% in one year and will surely put the cost of Christian education out of reach for some families, further reducing the total support for the high school ministry.

We prayerfully and respectfully ask that you revisit your congregational support pledge and let us know before the May 10 Federation meeting if you are able to add to your support for your high school's important ministry, as together we provide the "one thing needful" to the high school aged members of your church. If you have any questions or desire more information, we are absolutely willing to meet in person with your congregation's leadership to provide whatever you need. May God bless your deliberations and continue to bless our ministry at the high school, in your congregation and in His whole kingdom on earth.
