Mobile Phone Gospel Outreach Conference

The Christ in Media Institute sponsored a Christian Mobile Phone conference last month at Bethany College in Mankato, Minn. The conference included more than 30 high school and college students who presented strategies for Christian outreach via mobile phone technology.

"What a tremendous human resource the Lord has given us in these young people who are willing to use their knowledge of technology and their individual gifts to reach people with the gospel," says Dr. Tom Kuster, director, Christ in Media Institute.

The schools involved in the yearlong project include Northland Lutheran High School, Mosinee, Wis.; Rocky Mountain Lutheran High School, Denver, Colo.; Luther High School, Onalaska, Wis.; St. Croix Lutheran High School, West Saint Paul, Minn.; Wisconsin Lutheran College, Milwaukee, Wis.; Bethany Lutheran College, Mankato, Minn.; and Bethany Lutheran Theological Seminary, Mankato. Each of these schools assembled a team of students to work directly with mission fields to create mobile friendly Web sites, mobile apps, audio and video content, even a solar powered charging station that can download the Bible while a phone charges. Their task was to design a strategy for using mobile technology devices for gospel outreach and to support the work of the church in their chosen mission field. "As we create new

print content we have to be automatically thinking 'what does the digital version look like' and how will it be presented on a smartphone," says Kuster.

"This project really opened the eyes of the students to our mission fields, and it was an opportunity to bring them together with our world missionaries to use smartphone technology to spread the gospel everywhere," says Adviser Mr. Greg Schibbelhut, Luther High School.

The teams researched the country, with the guidance of the missionary/ consultant, in terms of message effectiveness, demographics, geography, history, culture (especially music, art, stories/legends), languages, and attitudes toward Christianity.

Trent Campbell , a junior from Rocky Mountain High School, says, "We designed a mobile friendly site for congregations in India <u>www.christinindia.com</u>. This project was incredible. One thing that I definitely took to heart was the teamwork needed, not only on our side, but also conversing back and forth with our contact in India to find out what he wanted to benefit his ministry."

Missionaries and consultants from Mexico, Pakistan, Malawi, Grenada, India, East Asia, and Chile worked with the students to develop the technology needed in their ministries. "The whole point of this project is to get more people to share the good news of Jesus. We need to help people in remote regions who have

smartphones gather people around God's Word," says Rev. Mike Hartman, missionary, Mexico.

While technology helps to spread the Word to a larger audience more quickly, it will never replace the individual contact needed to share the gospel. "The person -to-person contact, someone talking to someone about Jesus, is always basic and needs to be. Technology allows students with a segment of the <u>Come Follow</u> <u>Me</u> movie on their smartphone to share it with their friends at school. That then leads to a conversation about Jesus," says Kuster.
