

SERVICE OF GATHERING

stand

- M: Christ is arisen!
- C: He is risen indeed!
- M: God has ascended amid shouts of joy!
- C: Let us sing for joy to the LORD; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song.
- C: (sung) Alleluia! Sing to Jesus; His the scepter, his the throne; Alleluia! His the triumph, His the victory alone. Hark! The songs of peaceful Zion Thunder like a mighty flood: "Jesus out of ev'ry nation Has redeemed us by his blood."
- M: Why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."
- C: We believe and are sure that he is the Christ, the Son of the living God.
- M: God raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church.
- C: At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
- C: (sung) Alleluia! Bread of heaven, Here on earth our food, our stay; Alleluia! Here the sinful Flee to you from day to day. Intercessor, Friend of sinners, Earth's Redeemer, hear our plea Where the songs of all the sinless Sweep across the crystal sea.
- M: Jesus is the "Bread of heaven, here on earth our food, our stay" yet we have often despised this heavenly food and chosen to follow our own path. For this and all our sins, we bow before God and humbly ask his forgiveness.
- C: Holy and merciful Father; I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and action. I

SERVICE OF LESSONS

The Ascended Savior is at the Right Hand of God and serves us in his office of Prophet by speaking to us through the Word.

M: The visible presence of Jesus left his disciples 40 days after his resurrection. This past Thursday we celebrated the Festival of the Ascension. We know that Jesus is now seated at the right hand of the Father. What does this mean for our daily lives?

Jesus has rested from his work of paying for the sins of the world, but he is not completely at rest. He now uses his full divine power and glory on behalf of his people. He serves us at the right hand of God, a position of authority, not a place of rest.

The right hand of God is the almighty power of God.

The right hand of God in the Old Testament is used as a picture of the almighty power of God that works to provide our salvation

Psalm 118:15-21 Shouts of joy and victory resound in the tents of the righteous: "The LORD's right hand has done mighty things! The LORD's right hand is lifted high; the LORD's right hand has done mighty things!"

I will not die but live, and will proclaim what the LORD has done. The LORD has chastened me severely, but he has not given me over to death.

Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter and give thanks to the LORD.

This is the gate of the LORD

through which the righteous may enter. I will give you thanks, for you answered me; you have become my salvation.

Peter boldly describes Jesus as exalted at the right hand of God as our Savior

Acts 5:29-32

Peter and the other apostles replied: "We must obey God rather than men! The God of our fathers raised Jesus from the dead —whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel. We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

- M: Let us pray.
- C: Almighty God, we are separated from you by our sin. We are powerless to change this fact. We thank you that in your love and mercy you acted on our behalf. We thank you that you sent Jesus to live and die as our substitute. Truly your right hand has done mighty things!. Amen.

The Ascended Christ serves us as The Prophet

Our ascended Savior is not resting. He continues to serve us in his role as The Prophet by speaking to us through the Scriptures. In the Bible he provides us with a great cloud of witnesses to sustain us during our time on earth.

Hebrews 11:32-12:3

And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. Women received back their dead, raised to life again. Others were tortured and refused to be released, so that they might gain a better resurrection. Some faced jeers and flogging, while still others were chained and put in prison. They were stoned; they were sawed in two; they were put to death by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated—the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground. These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised. God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

- M: Let us pray.
- C: O Lord, we live in a world of ever-changing "truth". Help us to focus on your Word which is eternal truth. Let it be a light that shows us the beautiful depth of your love for us. May it keep us strong in the faith, now and always. Amen.

As our great high priest Jesus offered himself as the sacrifice for all sin. He continues to serve us in his role as Priest by interceding for us as we pray. No longer do we approach God by means of an earthly mediator. God himself speaks on our behalf.

Romans 8:31-34 11:32-12:3

What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died —more than that, who was raised to life —is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.

Hebrews 7:23-28

Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing in office; ²⁴ but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. ²⁵ Therefore he is able to save completely^[z] those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.

²⁶ Such a high priest meets our need—one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens. ²⁷ Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins once for all when he offered himself. ²⁸ For the law appoints as high priests men who are weak; but the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been made perfect forever.

M: Let us pray.

C: O Lord, you are always more willing to bless than we are to ask. Open our eyes to see the great gift you have given us in telling us to approach you directly. Move our hearts to use the gift of prayer as a way we carry out your command to love one another. Amen.

The Ascended Christ serves us as King as he rules all things for our eternal good.

As our great high priest Jesus offered himself as the sacrifice for all sin. He continues to serve us in his role as Priest by interceding for us as we pray. No longer do we approach God by means of an earthly mediator. God himself speaks on our behalf.

Ephesians 1:20-23

[That power] which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title that can be given, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

- M: Let us pray.
- C: Lord Jesus, you have promised that you are ruling all things for the good of your people, the church. Forgive me for the times I have doubted your good purposes in my life. Strengthen my trust in you that I may always walk by faith and not by sight. Amen.
