Confession

- M: If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness,
- C: we lie and do not live out the truth. (1 John 1:6)
- M: If we claim to be without sin,
- C: we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. (1 John 1:8)
- M: If we claim we have not sinned
- C: we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us. (1 John 1:10)

M: If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and

C: He will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)

M: You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command:

C: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

M: If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other.

The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, [sexual sins], and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. (Galatians 5:19-21)


C: When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord." And you forgave the guilt of my sin. (Psalm 32:3-5)

Absolution

- M: This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love:
- C: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. (1 John 4:9-10)
- M: He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world. (1 John 2:2)
- C: God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
- M: For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

(2 Corinthians 5:21, 14-15)

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. (Romans 8:1-2)

Nicene Creed






Words of Institution


