
# On the Mission Right Before Us

We tend to think of mission work as being "over there," something done in a far-away place. It is good and right to support foreign mission work with our prayers and offerings. However, something is off if we allow our appreciation for "over there" mission work to take our eyes off the mission that is right before us. Here is the two-fold reality worthy of our undivided attention this week. First, if we have seen the grace of God, we will serve as witnesses for Christ. Second, we need not cross the ocean to share the gospel. We can simply cross the street. In our various callings—parent or grandparent or sibling, friend or neighbor or coworker—God will provide one opportunity after another to serve as the witnesses Jesus has made us to be. So, let us continue to pray for and support "over there" mission work. But let us also give our undivided attention to the mission that God had placed right before each of us.

### THE WORD


First Lesson Isaiah 43:8-13

Those who have seen what the Lord has done are witnesses who testify on his behalf right where they live.

- <sup>8</sup> Bring out the people who are blind, though they have eyes, and the people who are deaf, though they have ears.
- Let all the nations be gathered together,
  and let peoples be assembled.
  Who among them has declared this?
  Who has made known to us the former things?

### Refrain

Gospel Lesson Luke 8:26-39

Jesus sets a demon-possessed man free then instructs the man to return to his home and be a witness to the goodness of God.

<sup>26</sup> Jesus and his disciples sailed down to the region of the Gerasenes, which is across from Galilee. <sup>27</sup> When Jesus stepped ashore, a man from the town met him. He was possessed by demons and for a long time had not worn any clothes. He did not live in a house but in the tombs. <sup>28</sup> When he saw Jesus, he cried out, fell down before him, and said with a loud voice, "What do I have to do with you, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, don't torment me!" <sup>29</sup> For Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. In fact, the unclean spirit had seized him many times. He was kept under guard, and although he was bound with chains and shackles, he would break the restraints and was driven by the demon into deserted places.

<sup>30</sup> Jesus asked him, "What is your name?"

He said, "Legion," because many demons had gone into him. <sup>31</sup> They were begging Jesus that he would not order them to go into the abyss. <sup>32</sup> A herd of many pigs was feeding there on the mountain. The demons begged Jesus to let them go into the pigs, and he gave them permission. <sup>33</sup> The demons went out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and drowned.

<sup>34</sup> When those who were feeding the pigs saw what happened, they ran away and reported it in the town and in the countryside. <sup>35</sup> People went out to see what had happened. They came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone out, sitting at Jesus' feet. He was clothed and in his right mind, and the people were afraid. <sup>36</sup> Those who saw it told them how the demon-possessed man was saved. <sup>37</sup> The whole crowd of people from the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them, because they were gripped with great fear.

As Jesus got into the boat and started back, <sup>38</sup> the man from whom the demons had gone out begged to be with him. But Jesus sent him away, saying, <sup>39</sup> "Return to your home and tell how much God has done for you." Then he went through the whole town proclaiming what Jesus had done for him. (EHV)

C: Praise be to you, O Christ!


#### NICENE CREED


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Sermon 2 Timothy 1:3–10

- <sup>3</sup> I thank God, whom I serve with a clean conscience as my ancestors did, as I constantly remember you in my prayers night and day. <sup>4</sup> When I remember your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. <sup>5</sup> I remember your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am convinced that it also lives in you.
- <sup>6</sup> For this reason I am reminding you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. <sup>7</sup> For God did not give us a timid spirit, but a spirit of power and love and sound judgment. <sup>8</sup> So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Instead, join with me in suffering for the gospel while relying on the power of God. <sup>9</sup> He saved us and called us with a holy calling, not because of our works, but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began, <sup>10</sup> and it has now been revealed through the appearance of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. C: We lift them up to the Lord.


M: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.


### **Words of Institution**

Morrison Location: using the sheets in the back of the church, elder's room or the sacristy room and in the basement.

Take one from the table if you would like the gluten-free combination cups that has both a gluten-free wafer on one side and wine on the other. DRIVE IN WORSHIPPERS: If you'd like communion today, please turn on your hazard lights ◀► during the distribution hymn. Leave them on until after Pastor visits your car. He will bring a combination cup which contains a wafer on one side and wine on the other.





## PERSONAL PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Q: What does God tell me about myself in his holy Word?

A: He says that I am a sinner and deserve only his punishment.

Q: What should I do if I am not aware of my sins or am not troubled by them?

A: I should examine myself according to the Ten Commandments and ask how well I have carried out my responsibilities as a husband or wife or single person, as a parent or child, an employer or employee, a teacher or student. Have I loved God with all my heart, gladly heard his Word, and patiently endured affliction? Have I been disobedient, proud, or unforgiving? Have I been selfish, lazy, envious, or quarrelsome? Have I lied or deceived, taken something not mine, or given anyone a bad name? Have I abused my body or permitted indecent thoughts to linger in my mind? Have I failed to do what is right and good?

Q: When I realize that I have sinned against God and deserve his punishment, what should I do?

A: I will confess before God all my sins, those which I remember as well as those of which I am unaware. I will pray to God for his mercy and forgiveness.

Q: How do I receive his gracious forgiveness?

A: His Word assures me that Jesus led a pure and holy life for me and died on the cross for me to pay the full price for all my sins. Through faith in Jesus, I have been clothed in my Savior's perfect righteousness and holiness.

Q: What further assurance do I have that Jesus is mine and I am his?

A: In Holy Communion he gives me his body and blood together with the bread and wine as a truly life-giving food and drink to unite me with him and my fellow believers. By means of this sacrament, Jesus not only forgives my sins but sweeps away all my doubts about his love for me, gives me his own strength to live a God-pleasing life, and grants me a joyful foretaste of heaven.

Q: How can I be sure that I receive all these blessings in the Lord's Supper?

A: I have his own word spoken as his last will and testament on the night before he died. There he tells me: "Take and eat; this is my body. Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

Q: How will I respond to this priceless gift from Jesus?

A: I will daily thank and praise him for his love to me. With his help I will fight temptation, do my best to correct whatever wrongs I have done, and serve him and those around me with love and good works.

Lord Jesus, with joy and gratitude I now come to your table to receive the precious food of your life-giving body and blood. May it strengthen me to remain in you as you remain in me, so that I bear much fruit in devoted service to you and in acts of kindness to others. Amen.
