
Undivided Attention On the One Thing Needful

Most would agree with Jesus' teaching that "Few things are needed" (Luke 10:42). We understand that people often confuse their wants with needs. We might want many things; but in reality, we only need a few things. So, we would agree with Jesus. "Few things are needed." However, Jesus said more. "Few things are needed—or indeed only one." Now we might object. There seems to be more than one true need. We need water, food, clothing, shelter, friendship, etc. Yet, what Jesus said is true. Because only one thing—the gospel—can create and sustain the faith that makes one God's dear child and an heir of the everlasting kingdom. If you didn't have water, you would die in a few days; without oxygen, in a few minutes. But without Jesus speaking to us through his Word, there is no hope for eternal life in heaven. We literally need the gospel more than water or oxygen. So, let us listen to Jesus speak, giving him our undivided attention.

INVOCATION AND CONFESSION OF SINS

Minister: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

Congregation: And also with you.

Silence for personal reflection

- M: Isaiah said of the Savior: "A bruised reed He will not break," (Isaiah 42:3) and again: "He was bruised for our iniquities...by His wounds we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5)
- C: We have come bruised by the actions of others and bruised by our repeated falls into sin.
- M: Isaiah says that God the Father sent Jesus "to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives...to comfort all who mourn." (Isaiah 61:1-2)
- C: We come broken in spirit because we cannot pay for our wrongs, broken in heart because we long for the peace of forgiveness.

WORDS OF FORGIVENESS:

- M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given His only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Because of Jesus' atoning work, God assures us in the Bible:
- C: "As far as the East is from the West, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." (Psalm 103:12)
- M: He says, "I will forgive their wickedness and I will remember their sins no more." (Jeremiah 31:24)
- C: "The blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin." (1 John 2:7)
- M: After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit...
- C: If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven." (John 20:22,23)
- M: Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: May the God of Hope fill us with joy and peace in believing. Amen.

THE WORD

First Lesson Genesis 18:1-14

With his gracious visit and gracious words, the Lord gives Sarah exactly what she needs most—a strengthened faith in God's promise of a child.

¹The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he was sitting by the door to his tent during the heat of the day. ²Abraham looked up, and he saw three men standing in front of him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them, and he bowed down to the ground. ³He said, "My lord, if I have now found favor in your sight, please do not pass your servant by. ⁴Now let me get a little water so that all of you can wash your feet and rest under the tree. ⁵Let me get some bread so that you can refresh yourselves. After that you may go your way. That is why you have come to your servant."

They said, "Yes, do as you have said."

⁶Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quickly prepare twenty quarts of fine flour, knead it, and make some loaves of bread." ⁷Abraham ran to the herd, brought a good, tender calf, and gave it to the servant. He hurried to prepare it. ⁸He took cheese curds, milk, and the calf that he had prepared and set it before them. He stood beside them under the tree while they ate.

⁹They asked him, "Where is Sarah, your wife?"

He said, "She is over there in the tent."


¹⁰One of the men said, "I will certainly return to you when this season comes around next year. Then Sarah your wife will have a son."

Grace to you and peace from God our Father.


³We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love that you have for all the saints ⁵because of the hope that is stored up for you in heaven. You have already heard about this in the word of truth, the gospel ⁶that is present with you now. The gospel is bearing fruit and growing in the entire world, just as it also has been doing among you from the day you heard it and came to know the grace of God in truth. ⁷You learned this from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf. ⁸He is the one who told us about your love in the Spirit.

⁹For this reason, from the day we heard about your love, we also have not stopped praying for you. We keep asking that you would be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding, ¹⁰so that you might live in a way that is worthy of the Lord. Our goal is that you please him by bearing fruit in every kind of good work and by growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹as you are being strengthened with all power because of his glorious might working in you. Then you will have complete endurance and patience, joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light.

¹³The Father rescued us from the domain of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. (EHV)


