I'm a Church Member - Week 1

I Will Be a Functioning Church Member

When people hear membership they think about being part of a gym or a wholesale club. Membership is often thought of to come with privileges, perks, and benefits. Members are served. Is this what it means to be a member of a Christian church? Paul explains the metaphor of the church as being a body with many members with Christ as the head (1 Corinthians 12 and Romans 12). At the heart of this is love (1 Corinthians 13). Forgiven by the love of God through the love Jesus has for us to win us forgiveness we can love God and others. "Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." He has place us all in the church with different gifts. In this series we look to build a strong healthy church by asking the question "What does it mean to be a church member?"

Week 1 – Many churches only have 1/3 of their membership active and functioning. Meaning if your membership is 300 only 100 are regularly in worship and serve in joy. This week we look at what it means to be a functioning member of the body of Christ led by his love.

Church of God, Elect and Glorious CW 854

Gathering Rite

M: What does God tell us about ourselves in his holy Word?

C: He says "There is no one righteous, not even one; there is no one who does good, not even one." (Romans 3, Psalm 14 & 53)

M: How has this shown itself in our lives?

C: We have not loved you with our whole hearts and lives. We have not loved those around us as we love ourselves.

M: What should we do if we are not aware of our sins or are not troubled by them?

C: We should examine ourselves according to the Ten Commandments and ask ourselves individually:

How well have I carried out my responsibilities as a husband or wife or single person, as a parent or child, an employer or employee, a teacher or student?

Have I loved God with all my heart, gladly heard his Word, and patiently endured affliction?

Have I been disobedient, proud, or unforgiving? Have I been selfish, lazy, envious or quarrelsome?

Have I lied or deceived, taken something not mine, or given anyone a bad name?

Have I abused my body or permitted indecent thoughts to linger in my mind? Have I failed to do what is good and right?

- M: When we realize that we have sinned against God and deserve his punishment, what should we do?
- C: We will confess before God all our sins, those which we remember as well as those of which we are unaware. We pray to God for his mercy and forgiveness.

Silence for personal prayer and confession.


First Lesson Romans 12:1-5

Second Lesson Matthew 20:20-28

 20 Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him.

²¹ "What is it you want?" he asked.

She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom."

²² "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?"

"We can," they answered.

²³ Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father."

²⁴ When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers. ²⁵ Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ²⁶ Not so with you. 

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Sermon

¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.
¹³ For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.
¹⁴ Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.

¹⁵ Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸ But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. ¹⁹ If they were all one part, where would the body be? ²⁰ As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

C: ²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!"

M: ²² On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, ²⁴ while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it,

C: ²⁵ so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. ²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

M: ²⁷ Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a member of it. ²⁸ And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues. ²⁹ Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? ³⁰ Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹ Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.

And yet I will show you the most excellent way.

^{13:1} If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

⁴ Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.

C: ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears.

M: 11 When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child.

C: When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. ¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face.

M: Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

 13 And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love. (NIV)


